Leadership Development to infantry recruits for the UK MoD

The Infantry needs consistently high quality leadership and team-building training in order to deliver the professional soldier.

THE TRAINING REQUIREMENT

The Army has a requirement to deliver adventurous training to all Infantry recruits as part of their basic training. Adventurous training is an important element of the training programme supporting leadership and team-building training to all Infantry recruits.

THE TQ PROGRAMME

Based at Halton Army camp in Lancashire, TQ is at the heart of the programme that delivers adventure training to all Infantry recruits aged between 17 and 26. A team of highly qualified and respected trainers deliver a wide range of outdoor, experiential activities as the medium for leadership development and team-building. TQ trainers deliver a 4 day programme of canoeing, kayaking, climbing, caving, hill-walking and mountain biking to between 60 and 120 trainees per week.

Since commencement of the contract, the programme has been mapped to the modern apprenticeship framework, thereby adding value to the client by enabling participants to gain additional accredited qualifications.

MEASURING SUCCESS:

A quality assurance inspection was recently carried out by the Army Recruiting and Training Division on the training provision provided by TQ.

The inspection was passed with flying colours and the inspecting officer, Major Billings declared his intention to use the methodology and delivery in place at Halton as a **“model for best practice across the army”**.
